What to avoid:

- » Casinos and horse tracks
- » Contact with known gamblers
- » Gambling online
- » Sharing information about you or your team that could be used for sports wagering purposes



Consequences:

- » Loss of eligibility
- » Financial hardship
- » Jail time
- » Media scrutiny
- » Run-ins with organized crime
- » Loss of jobs



Know the Rules

Do not place a wager on any college or professional sporting event. This includes:

- » Fantasy leagues, sports pools and March Madness brackets (if an entry fee is required and a prize is awarded).



Do not share information that can be used to wager on sports. This includes:

- » Team disciplinary actions
- » New plays
- » Team morale
- » Injuries
