

## League Residency Requirements

A currently enrolled student-athlete is allowed to participate in an NCAA-certified summer league only if the league play is within 100 air miles of:

1. The student-athlete's legal residence at the end of the previous academic year; or
2. The institution the student-athlete last attended as a regular student.

As a condition of certification, league operators will be required to verify **prior to** competition that all Division I student-athletes are in compliance with the residency requirements. If no league exists within the 100 air mile radius, a student-athlete may participate in the summer league located closest to the student's official residence. Allowing a student-athlete to participate that does not meet this requirement will render the student-athlete ineligible for collegiate competition, which will render the league ineligible for certification the following year.

Not to be confused with the event adjoining-state requirements.

If an activity receives both event and league certification; all participants must comply with both the 100-mile rule and the adjoining-state rule.
