

2018 NCAA Regional Rules Seminars Daily Schedule

Monday Afternoon

1-1:55 p.m.

Association-Wide Institutional Performance Program – Foundational

This session will provide an overview of the NCAA Institutional Performance Program in each division. Attendees will learn the purpose and status of IPP in each division; effectively understand and be able to explain the content of the data management system to institutional constituents; and become aware of any new IPP initiatives, best practices and applicable timelines.

Division I Recruiting: Official and Unofficial Visits – Foundational Plus

This session will provide an intermediate-level overview of Division I official and unofficial visit legislation by analyzing potential issues related to comprehensive factual scenarios. Session attendees should have a base-level understanding of fundamental official and unofficial visit legislation.

1-2 p.m.

Division I NCAA Bootcamp – Foundational

This session is designed for institutional staff members who are not primarily part of the athletics staff at their institutions. This session will provide a broad overview of the NCAA and the interface an athletics department has with other areas on campus (admissions, financial aid, registrar, etc.). This will also be an opportunity for attendees to ask questions about best practices for conducting day-to-day business with athletics. Anyone new to interacting with athletics is encouraged to attend.

Association-Wide Secondary/Level III Violations – Foundational

This session will provide an entry-level overview of secondary/Level III violations. In this session, attendees will learn to identify and analyze fundamental secondary/Level III violations, anticipate applicable penalties and corrective actions and effectively explain the self-reporting process to institutional constituents.

2:10-3:40 p.m.

Division I Introduction to Social Media – Foundational

This session will provide an entry-level overview of Division I legislation as it relates to the use of social media. This session is designed for new compliance professionals. Attendees will learn to identify fundamental legislation, effectively explain the legislation to institutional constituents, apply specific legislation to factual scenarios and analyze potential social media recruiting and promotional issues.

Division I Welcome to the World of Academics – Foundational

This session will provide an entry-level overview of Division I academic legislation and processes, including an introduction to progress-toward-degree requirements, transfers and the NCAA Division I Academic Performance Program. This session is designed for new academic and compliance professionals. Attendees will learn to identify fundamental academic legislation, effectively explain the legislation to institutional constituents, apply specific academic legislation to factual scenarios and analyze potential academic issues and processes.

Association-Wide National Letter of Intent – Foundational

In this session, attendees will learn to identify appropriate National Letter of Intent policies, procedures and interpretations; effectively apply the NLI guidelines; and address and analyze NLI factual scenarios faced on campus. This session is intended for Division I and II participants.

4-4:55 p.m.

Division I New Legislation – Foundational Plus Dialogue

This session is intended to allow for review and discussion of a subset (5-15) of the more complex adopted proposals from the last legislative cycle, either from an application or interpretation perspective.

4:30-5:30 p.m.

Division I Introductory Video Question and Answer – Foundational Dialogue

In this interactive session, presenters will lead discussion to assist in clarifying information presented as part of the foundational video package available prior to the 2018 Regional Rules Seminars. Attendees will be encouraged to raise questions and scenarios as the group identifies appropriate legislation and applies the legislation to the factual scenarios.

Association-Wide Office of the Committees on Infractions: Timeline of an Infractions Case and Hot Topics Involving Infractions Process – Foundational

Members of the Office of the Committees on Infractions will provide an overview of the procedural timeline of an infractions case—from the notice of allegations to the decision release—for all three divisions. Additionally, session participants will have an opportunity to hear from members of the NCAA Division I Committee on Infractions on hot topics involving the infractions process.

Division I Enforcement: Conducting a Collaborative Investigation – Dialogue

This session will focus on the cooperative principal and provide enforcement's perspective on a collaborative versus noncollaborative investigation. This session will also provide an opportunity for detailed dialogue on what constitutes exemplary cooperation. Finally, the session will allow for discussion on the role of outside counsel in the infractions cases and the maintenance of appropriate lines of communications throughout the investigation and case processing.

Division I Financial Aid – Foundational Plus

This session will provide an intermediate-level overview of Division I financial aid legislation by analyzing potential financial aid issues related to comprehensive factual scenarios. Session attendees should have a base-level understanding of fundamental financial aid legislation.

Division I Introduction to Recruiting – Foundational Plus

This session will provide an intermediate-level overview of Division I recruiting legislation by analyzing potential recruiting issues related to comprehensive factual scenarios regarding contacts and evaluations, tryouts and camps and clinics. Session attendees should have a base-level understanding of fundamental recruiting legislation.

Division I Legislative Process/Drafting 101 – Foundational

This session will provide an overview of the Division I legislative process as well as insight on how to draft and submit legislative proposals. This session will be offered twice, and each session will be limited to 40 attendees. Registrants will be notified via separate email prior to the 2018 Regional Rules Seminars as to their securing a spot in one of the sessions.

Division I Progress Toward Degree – Foundational Plus

This session will include an intermediate-level overview of the application of Division I academic legislation and issues related to progress-toward-degree requirements. This session is designed for academic and compliance professionals. Attendees will use case studies and group discussion to review the application of Bylaw 14.4. Attendees should have a fundamental understanding of progress-toward-degree legislation and may want to attend the Welcome to the World of Academics foundational session (2:15-4:15 p.m. Monday).

Division II: Day 1 Morning Session (Opening, Eligibility and Newly Adopted Legislation)

The morning session on Day 1 includes two topics: Eligibility and Newly Adopted Legislation. Day 1 sessions are intended for all Division II attendees. Appropriate breaks will be provided throughout the day.

Eligibility: This session will provide an overview of the new Division II initial-eligibility requirements effective August 2018, resources available through the NCAA Eligibility Center Portal and the two-year college transfer rules. Participants will analyze and apply the legislation by working through transfer certification scenarios.

Newly Adopted Legislation: Is your campus prepared to apply the newly adopted Division II legislation? Materials presented during this session will allow participants to engage in group dialogue, ask questions and share ideas.

Division I Enforcement Violations and Trends Dialogue: What's Happened Since the Last Regional Rules Seminars – Advanced Dialogue

This session will provide an advanced-level overview and discussion of current Division I enforcement-related issues. In this session, attendees will review and discuss Division I Level I and Level II violation trends, recent case trends and other areas that may impact the enforcement/infractions process, including the potential impact of the work of the Commission on College Basketball.

Division I Financial Aid Question and Answer – Dialogue

In this interactive session, presenters will lead discussion regarding Division I financial aid legislation. Attendees will be encouraged to raise questions and scenarios as the group identifies appropriate legislation, applies the legislation to the factual scenarios and provides feedback regarding current legislation application and legislation review to date.

Division I Legislative Process/Drafting 101 – Foundational

This session will provide an overview of the Division I legislative process as well as insight on how to draft and submit legislative proposals. This session will be offered twice, and each session will be limited to 40 attendees. Registrants will be notified via separate email prior to the 2018 Regional Rules Seminars as to their securing a spot in one of the sessions.

Division I Progress Toward Degree – Advanced

This session will provide an advanced review of Division I progress-toward-degree issues and complex progress-toward-degree scenarios. The session will be delivered as a combination of lecture and workshop. This session is designed for academic and compliance professionals. Attendees should have a good understanding of progress-toward-degree legislation and may want to attend the Division I Progress Toward Degree Foundational Plus session (8-8:55 a.m. Tuesday). This session is offered twice, and each session will be limited to 75 attendees. Registrants will be notified via separate email prior to the 2018 Regional Rules Seminars as to their securing a spot in one of the sessions.

Division I Recruiting: Precollege Expenses – Foundational Plus

This session will provide an intermediate-level overview of Division I precollege expenses legislation by analyzing potential issues related to comprehensive factual scenarios. Session attendees should have a base-level understanding of fundamental precollege expenses legislation.

10:35-11:30 a.m.

Association-Wide National Letter of Intent – Foundational

In this session, attendees will learn to identify appropriate National Letter of Intent policies, procedures and interpretations; effectively apply the NLI guidelines; and address and analyze NLI factual scenarios faced on campus. This session is intended for Division I and II participants.

Division I Enforcement Elite Prospective Student-Athlete Recruitment: Education and Monitoring Recommendations – Panel Discussion

This panel discussion, moderated by the enforcement staff, will focus on how schools conduct their academic and amateurism eligibility reviews and any updates to those processes in light of recommendations from the NCAA Division I Board of Directors.

Division I Introduction to Playing and Practice Seasons – Foundational Plus

This session will provide an intermediate-level overview of Division I playing and practice seasons legislation by analyzing potential issues related to comprehensive factual scenarios. Session attendees should have a base-level understanding of fundamental playing and practice seasons legislation.

Division I Progress Toward Degree: Improving the Certification Process – Advanced Dialogue

This session, designed for academic and compliance professionals, will review different processes for certifying student-athletes' eligibility and how to avoid common pitfalls. Attendees will benefit from hearing from their contemporaries in the certification process and from discussing ways to improve eligibility certification procedures on their own campuses to ensure accuracy and efficiency.

Division I Revenue Distributions and Membership Financial Reporting – Foundational

This session will provide an overview of the Division I revenue distributions and membership financial reporting, and related reference tools. For revenue distribution, topics will include required submissions, fund calculations and best practices. For membership financial reporting, topics will include recent updates to reporting categories and agreed-upon procedures.

Tuesday Afternoon

Division I Eligibility Center Hot Topics – Foundational Dialogue

This session, primarily designed for Division I attendees, will provide an opportunity for NCAA Eligibility Center staff to lead a discussion related to current Eligibility Center processes and hot topics.

Division I Enforcement Academic Misconduct Forum: Current Landscape – Dialogue

This session will provide an opportunity for attendees to provide feedback on recent academic misconduct infractions decisions and related issues.

Division I Introduction to Personnel – Foundational Plus

This session will provide an intermediate-level overview of Division I personnel legislation by analyzing potential issues related to comprehensive factual scenarios. Session attendees should have a base-level understanding of fundamental personnel legislation.

Division I Student-Athlete Reinstatement Overview – Foundational Dialogue

This session will provide attendees with an overview of the reinstatement process and highlight aspects of staff decision-making through review and facilitated discussion of recent student-athlete reinstatement cases. Staff will guide attendees through the student-athlete reinstatement process and highlight certain aspects of each case, applicable guidelines, precedent and best practices.

Division III Panel Part 1: Ethics in Compliance

Join NCAA staff and membership peers for a panel discussion designed to focus on best practices and ethics in athletics compliance.

1:30-4:30 p.m.

Division II: Day 1 Afternoon Session (Financial Aid and National Letter of Intent, Tryouts and Initiatives)

The afternoon session on Day 1 includes three topics: Financial Aid and National Letter of Intent; Tryouts; and Division II Initiatives. Day 1 sessions are intended for all Division II attendees. Appropriate breaks will be provided throughout the day.

Financial Aid and National Letter of Intent: This interactive session will assist campus and conference administrators in navigating challenging scenarios regarding the reduction of a student-athlete's athletics aid and the application of new financial aid legislation effective in August 2018.

Tryouts: Have you ever wondered if there is an easier way to apply legislation related to prospective student-athlete or enrolled student tryouts? This session will equip participants with tools to navigate that process. Participants will have the opportunity to work individually and with a group to explore basic and complex concepts related to conducting tryouts.

Initiatives: This session outlines new and exciting compliance-related initiatives managed by the Division II academic and membership affairs staff. Participants will receive updates on new and developing programs and will be given the opportunity to provide feedback regarding these initiatives.

Division I Financial Aid Question and Answer – Dialogue

This advanced session will provide attendees with a review of Division I countable athletically related activity and required athletically related activity legislation through a variety of scenarios. This session will also allow for discussion and feedback from the membership regarding implementation feedback and lessons learned.

Division III Governance Hot Topics

Join the NCAA governance staff for a discussion on Division III strategic and identity priorities and hot topics. This session will update participants on current initiatives led by Division III governance, and participants will be asked to engage in discussions to shape future policy decisions.

Division I Promotional Activities – Foundational Plus

This session will provide an intermediate-level overview of Division I promotional activities legislation by analyzing potential issues related to comprehensive factual scenarios. Session attendees should have a base-level understanding of promotional activities legislation.

Division I Let's Talk Transfers – Advanced Dialogue

This advanced session will provide attendees with a review of four-year transfer legislation (undergraduate and graduate) and practical approaches to a variety of transfer scenarios. This session will also examine transfer waiver scenarios with the opportunity to consider how the waiver directive applies. This session is designed for academic and compliance professionals. Attendees should have a base-level understanding of progress-toward-degree legislation as it applies to transfer student-athletes.

Division I Personnel: Individual Associated with a Prospect/Individual Associated with a Recruited Prospect – Advanced Dialogue

Attendees will learn to identify foundational principles associated with the applicable legislation and apply the legislation to realistic factual scenarios. Available compliance resources also will be provided.

Division II: Day 2 (Pre-/Post-Enrollment Amateurism, Social Media, Team Meeting and Closing)

This session will engage participants with the following topics: Pre- and Post-Enrollment Amateurism; Social Media; and Team Meeting. Participants will also see how the Division II academic and membership affairs staff conducts regular business in a team meeting environment. Finally, all participants will have the opportunity to test their knowledge by completing a series of tasks to successfully “escape” compliance camp. Appropriate breaks will be provided throughout the duration of the session.

Pre- and Post-Enrollment Amateurism: Participants will actively contribute and participate in group discussion regarding the application of Bylaws 12.1.2 (activities prior to initial full-time enrollment); 12.1.3 (permissible – following initial full-time collegiate enrollment); and 12.1.4 (impermissible – following initial full-time collegiate enrollment). This interactive session is designed to engage different learning styles of participants.

Social Media: Every time you turn around, there is something new in the social media industry. Reviewing basic to complex scenarios will help participants recognize when a particular activity or engagement on social media is permissible or impermissible.

Team Meeting: We all know that the Great and Powerful Oz was simply a man behind the curtain. Attendees will review examples of Division III questions submitted through the Requests/Self-Reports Online system reflecting the intersection between events involving prospective student-athletes and recruiting legislation.

Division III Bylaw 12: Organized Competition – Division-Wide

This session will review the application of Division III legislation related to amateurism with a specific focus on organized competition. Attendees will learn to identify the appropriate legislation and interpretations, and apply them to factual scenarios.

Division I Academic Update – Dialogue

This session will provide an update on key items being addressed by the NCAA Division I Committee on Academics. The update may include a review of any progress-toward-degree legislative concepts, the bylaw refresh and modernization project and the academic unit roll-out. This will also be an opportunity for the membership to ask questions about the Committee on Academics' areas of focus and to provide feedback on any items of specific concern.

Division I Medical Hardship Waivers – Foundational Dialogue

Division I Rules Question and Answer – Dialogue

In this interactive session, presenters will lead discussion regarding Division I legislative topic(s) not otherwise covered to be determined by membership input during the Regional Rules Seminars. Attendees will be encouraged to raise questions and scenarios as the group identifies appropriate legislation, applies the legislation to the factual scenarios and provides feedback regarding current legislation application. The topics will be communicated prior to the session.

Division III Interpretations Hour Question and Answer – Dialogue
