INFORMATIONAL ITEMS.

- 1. Intermediary accounts.** During the committee’s April 9-10 in-person meeting, the committee directed staff to collect information related to intermediary accounts, defined as entities that issue transcripts with proof of graduation (“POG”) without requiring anything of students beyond completion of coursework through a third party. Based on information collected, the committee affirmed that the review of an education entity that issues transcripts with proof of graduation (“POG”) without its own teachers providing instruction for academic courses (as defined by the NCAA) and no verification of high school graduation from the student’s parent or instructor will result in an account status of “None.” This policy does not include an education entity where participation in which satisfies the compulsory school attendance law.
